



## The Pupil Premium Statement 2019-2021

### What is Pupil Premium Funding?

“The Pupil Premium is designed to ensure that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most. The funding is allocated to Local Authorities and schools with pupils from Reception to Year 11 who are eligible for free school meals (FSM), are looked after or have parents currently in the Armed Forces. From April 2012 the coverage of the Premium was widened to include those eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years. The FSM/Ever 6 funding allocation per child is £1,345. The Service Children funding per pupil is £310.” Cambridgeshire Local Authority

### How is Pupil Premium money spent?

It is for schools to decide how Pupil Premium money is spent, since they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made for the individual pupils within their care. However, this additional funding, must be spent in a way that leads to improved attainment and a broadening of opportunities for these disadvantaged pupils.

Governors have a responsibility to make sure that:

- The school identifies these pupils.
- The school uses evidence from attainment and from talking to parents to identify the needs of these pupils.
- The money is spent directly on these pupils in the way that most effectively supports the identified needs.
