Home Learning Menu

Reading and Spellings

Please continue to read with your child for at least 15 minutes each day.

Spellings will be sent home every Friday. Please practise these at home ready for the spelling quiz that takes place in class on Fridays.

Maths

There will be a selection of Maths activities to complete on Mathletics. Your child's Mathletics login should be in their reading record. Please let us know if you have any issues with this.

Topic

Our topic this term is called 'Up, Up and Away'. We will look at journeys made by animals and people, including travelling to holiday destinations. We will also be learning about how transport has changed over time.

We would like you to complete three Topic or Science activities (or use your own ideas) by Friday 8th July 2022. Please take a photo of your project to bring or email it into school (office@thebellbird.cambs.sch.uk FAO: Year 1 teachers). We will have time to show these every week, usually on a Friday. Have fun!

We would like you to complete at least 3 of these:

- Draw a picture of a journey you have been on. It could be your journey to school, going on holiday, or even a bike ride!
- Make your own form of transport. You can do this on a computer, by hand, with Lego, or whatever you would like - use your imagination. (Avoid junk modelling as we will be doing this at school.)
- Find out about an animal's journey. You could think about birds that migrate, or the journey of fish, turtles or butterflies.
- Talk to someone you know about transport and travel in the past. How has it changed?
- Can you find out about a famous person who has changed how we travel, or has travelled in an interesting way? Think about astronauts, pilots, sailors.
- Make a presentation or a collage about transport you have used. You could use train tickets, maps or postcards.
- Listen to a piece of music and imagine a journey. Where does the music take you? How does it make you feel?

Science

In Science this term we are learning about plants, as well as continuing to think about seasonal change.

- Go on a plant hunt in your garden or around the village. You could take photos and find out the names of the plants/flowers you find.
- Create a picture of your favourite plant.
- Make a fruit salad with your family. Look at the seeds and talk about how plants grow. Find out where the fruit comes from.
- Make a list of all the plants you eat in a week.
- Find as many different leaves as you can. How could you sort them into groups?
- Make your own cress head out of an empty egg shell, some damp soil and some cress seeds. You can decorate your egg shell so it looks like a face.
- Can you identify any trees or plants near your home, in your garden or at a local park?
