Dear Parents and Carers

It has been lovely to continue to see the first signs of Spring. With more daylight, birdsong and snowdrops and daffodils popping up it has begun to feel like winter is leaving us again. Spring is such an optimistic time of year with new beginnings and the promise of warmer weather. We hope you and your family have been able to notice these things, perhaps you were able to take part in the Big Garden Birdwatch as we mentioned in our last newsletter.

Just like the cycle of the seasons, school has its own cycle of activities. The leadership team have undertaken our review mornings this half term. A great way to get into classes and have a look at learning across our school. This is a collaborative process with staff filling in learning surveys prior to our visits. We look at lessons, books and the learning environment, talk to the children and look at progress and attainment data. This culminates in a feedback discussion with the class teacher where we work together to discuss next steps. Our focus is always on 'soaring to success' for all pupils. In particular it has been great to see purposeful learning environments where the children are using the resources to make progress and lessons that are engaging and interesting resulting in pupils working hard to do their best. Pupils have told us that they like their learning because it is interesting but also because it is hard but they get there. All the children were able to tell us about strategies they use when they are stuck. These were varied and included talking to a friend, looking at a model in the class, checking previous work and asking an adult. It is positive to know that the children can independently use strategies to develop their learning, this is an area we are currently looking at as a staff to help children develop these skills.

In school the internal making good from the building work has continued with staff and children adapting well to this minor disruption. We are pleased to say that this phase of work is almost at an end. Thank you to parents for responding to different drop off and collection points as the work has progressed through classrooms. The finished classes are looking great!

Year 4 had their Bikeability training this term. It was great to see the children arriving with their bikes and accessing this important training which combines fitness with safety. Well done Year 4! Year 2 have been working hard on their London's Burning topic; finding out about the past whilst looking forward to their visit to London after half term. Year 5 have begun their unit of work on the Victorians and the children have shared their love of the fascinating elements of this topic, they have used this knowledge to write some fabulous newspaper articles with some rip roaring headlines! In Year 1 maths has been standing out for all the right reasons. Having spent a lot of time building up their confidence using objects to add and subtract, the children have been developing their mental and written methods for addition and subtraction, great work. Year 3 have been building up their knowledge of the rainforest with some fascinating facts. Year 6 have been working on their computing skills developing 'Choose your own adventure stories', a great way to combine English and computing learning with a fun outcome. Finally Reception have been continuing to settle in to school life. Reception have also begun joining us in Celebration assemblies on Fridays. It has been lovely to have them with us and watch them enjoying celebrating their peers achievements. It is hard to believe they are already half way through their first year at school! Well done Reception.

We hope that you and your children have a good break over half term. There are further communications coming out today relating to DT and English which will give you some ideas of things to do with your children if you are looking for activities. We look forward to welcoming you back to school on Monday 20th February.
