Dear Parents, Carers and Children,

As is the case every year, the autumn term is already flying by! The warm weather has left us and we are now facing downpours of rain. It is such a relief to have our roof fully repaired as we face the heavy rains this year.

The children continue to settle into the school year, and are impressing us with their attitudes to learning. As we shared in our last newsletter, for the past two weeks the teachers have been meeting to look at pupil progress to ensure that time is maximised to meet pupil needs. These meetings have been led by Mrs Dix and members of the leadership team. The staff have been rigorous in their analysis of the children's potential attainment. You will find out more about the support your child is receiving at parent consultations in October.

Meanwhile in class the children have been ensuring they keep doing their best in their learning. To support them in 'picking up where they left off', all of the children have a piece of their writing from the end of last year in their books. This is being used as a motivation to remind the children of their best work. It has been wonderful to go into classes and be able to talk to children about their learning with this useful reference point.









Speaking of links to last year, the photos above are just a small selection of photos of the large collection of books we were able to purchase following the hugely successful spellathon in the Summer term. The children raised a very impressive total of just over £2000, meaning we were able to purchase a broad range of texts to engage all readers. There really is something for everyone in these wonderful additions to our library. Thank you for supporting the children to achieve this impressive fundraising amount.

We know that lots of children will have kept reading over the summer, it really is a great way to keep your brain engaged and your vocabulary growing. If your child took part in the summer reading challenge and achieved a certificate or medal, they are welcome to bring this in to school on a Friday to share during the celebration assembly. We are always delighted to celebrate reading at The Bellbird!

Moving on to a different topic, as the school year develops clubs are starting up again and one of these has been gardening club. As part of their work this year our gardeners are taking a full journey from soil to table. They have harvested wheat and this week they thrashed it to make flour. A fabulous process to go through to remember where are food comes from and how something like wheat can be transformed into a versatile and useful product. This will be a feature of our harvest assembly I am sure. Well done gardening club!

### Attendance

Supporting your child to attend school and to be on time is one of the biggest ways you can support them to 'soar to success'.

We know have a new display in our school main entrance area reminding us all of the impact of good attendance and punctuality. Do take a look if you are heading to the office. In particular the following quote is an important one to remember:

Data from 2019 shows that **84% of Key Stage 2 pupils who had 100% attendance achieved the expected standard**, compared to just **40% of pupils who were persistently absent across the key stage**. (source DfE)
