Head's cluster group

As a school we look beyond our gates for support, challenge and advice as well as within our team. We are all learners. A great example of this is the Head's cluster that Mrs Clayton and Mrs Pentney attend every half term. This is a group of local schools who come together to share challenges, problem solve and consider how joint working can benefit us. One of our current projects we are developing, will involve meeting with teachers from other schools to moderate writing assessments. We will be supported by the local authority who will work with teams from across the schools to look at age related writing expectations for each of the year groups. Working together in this way is a great way to ensure we are accurate, and also an opportunity to share good approaches and curriculum ideas.

The most recent Head's cluster meeting saw the cluster school learn about the support the Cambridge and Peterborough Teaching School Hub can offer us.
