Art

DT

- Make a model of Stonehenge
- Make a stone age pot or necklace
- Try creating a box from a 2D net.
- Explore how different boxes are put together.
- Do some prehistoric cooking: e.g. baked salmon, grilled trout and berry pudding.

English

- Read 'Stig of the Dump' by Clive King or 'Ug' by Raymond Briggs
- Write a diary as a stone age child
- Write a story based on the Stone, Bronze or Iron Age.
- Create a wordless picture book.

Practise 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 10 multiplication tables.

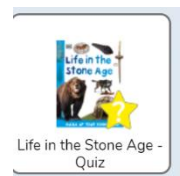


History
