We will have time to show these every week, usually on a Friday. <b>Have fun!</b></p>	<p><b><u>Weekly Home Learning Tasks</u></b></p> <p><u>Reading</u> – read for 10 minutes every day.</p> <p><u>Spelling</u> – learn your spelling words for a spelling quiz every Friday.</p> <p><u>Maths</u> – look for numbers in your environment, count everyday objects and learn your number bonds to 20.</p>	<p><b><u>English</u></b></p> <p>Can you write a book review of one of your favourite books with the title of the book and a sentence to explain why you like this book so much. You may want to bring the book into school to share with the class.</p> <p>Draw a simple picture and write a description of your favourite character from a story book of your choice.</p>	<p><b><u>Science</u></b></p> <p>As part of our science learning on how the seasons change can you keep a record of weather you have observed over the course of a week.</p> <p>If you have access to a thermometer at home could you record the temperature over the course of a week to bring in and share with the class. Can you compare the temperature inside and outside your house?</p>

If you do any cooking or baking at home can you write the recipe of what you made.</p> <p>Take photographs of your dish or draw a picture of what you made.</p>
