Whole School Evacuation Drill

At The Bellbird Primary School, the safety and well-being of our pupils and staff are our top priorities. As part of our ongoing commitment to emergency preparedness, we will be conducting a **whole school evacuation drill** in the coming weeks. This drill follows our recent fire drill and invacuation practice, helping to ensure that everyone knows what to do in the event of a critical incident requiring the full evacuation of the school site.

Pupils will be fully briefed by their class teachers before the drill takes place. Please note that a selected number of pupils – for medical/ health reasons - will not be participating in the drill. If you feel that your child may find this experience unsettling, we advise that you practise walking to and from Sawston Free Church, which is our designated emergency location. Children can then become familiar with the route and building. We appreciate your support in helping us to prepare our pupils for all possible scenarios in a calm and reassuring manner.

Wheelchair Request

If you have a spare or disused wheelchair at home, we would greatly appreciate any donations or offers to sell one to the school. In the event of an emergency, having a wheelchair on hand will help ensure the safety and well-being of pupils who may need assistance. Your generosity could make a real difference.
