Bringing Equipment into School


- Please limit the amount of equipment the children bring into school.

The Bellbird Primary School 'Soaring to Success' Year 2 Autumn Term 2025

We will be learning:

Art and DT:

In art, we will be creating maps using a variety of art forms including drawing, felt making, print making and designing stained glass.

In Design and technology, the children will be identifying stable and unstable structures, identifying features which make a chair stable and finally they will use their knowledge to design a chair for baby bear.

Topic:

Geography: In our geography unit we will be learning to identify human and physical features and we will identify landmarks in Scotland, England, Wales and Northern Ireland

History: In history we will learning about how schools have changed since 1900. We will be visiting Braintree Museum on Tuesday 11th November.

PE:

Indoor PE for Goldfinches will be on Tuesday morning and Skylarks will have indoor PE on Wednesday. Outdoor PE/adventurous activities will take place on a Thursday for both classes. Please ensure your child comes into school wearing suitable PE kit and footwear.

RE:

Children will be learning about Christianity.
They will be listening to and telling stories
from the Bible. They will be learning about
how Christians and Jewish people celebrate
Harvest time.

PSHE:

Our PSHE work focuses on understanding our emotions. We will build on our existing vocabulary linked to emotions and we will practise a range of calming down strategies. We will also learn what rights, rules and responsibilities are and how they help to keep us safe.

English:

The children will start the term by writing their own story based on the book Frog and the Stranger by Max Velthuijs. The children will be identifying the features of instructional writing and composing their own set of instructions. They will also be writing list poems about people who are special to them.

Reading

The children will change their home reading books once a week. Their reading record books will be checked during reading practice sessions.

Phonics, Spelling and Handwriting

The children follow the Little Wandle revised Letters and Sounds phonic programme and our focus this term will be revising Phase 5. Spellings will be given out on a Friday and the test will take place on the following Friday. The weekly spelling lists will be coming home in the Letter-join font and there will be up to three

Music:

We will study the Charanga unit Hands, Heart, Feet, learning about pulse, rhythm and some of the characteristics of South African music.

Mathematics:

Our maths work this term will focus on time, place value, counting, comparing and representing numbers to 100, and reading and writing numbers in numerals and words. The children will be counting forwards and backwards in 1s, 2s, 5s and 10s

We will then move onto addition and subtraction of two-digit numbers.

All year 2 children will have a Mathletics account to access in school and at home. Mathletics is an online learning platform that allows parents to see the methods we use to teach calculation skills and provides the children with opportunities to practise skills at home. Every two weeks we will set weekly Mathletics tasks for children to do at home

Science:

Our first unit is 'Animals Including Humans'.

We will learn how animals, including humans, have offspring that grow into adults. We will find out about and describe the basic needs of animals.

We will learn about the importance for humans of exercise, eating the right amounts of different types of food, and hygiene.

We will also be learning about the scientific illustrator Maria Merian.

- On Tuesday 11th November, we will be visiting
- Braintree Museum.
- Voluntary contributions and parental help with the day will be requested.
- More details will follow.



Reading in Year 2

Reading continues to be at the heart of the English curriculum.

Reading Record Books – need to be brought in to school every day.

Please keep the record books in the plastic zip folder. Books will be changed once a week on the same day each week.

The library will soon be up and running. The children have either a non-fiction or a picture book for up to two weeks.





Reading in Year 2

Please listen to your child read for at least 15 – 20 minutes most days.

Reading Practice sessions with the teacher or teaching assistant will take place on a regular basis.

On a Friday, if a parent or other adult has signed or initialled the book to indicate that the child has read at least twice that week, the child will be awarded two house points.





English

Spellings

We will start by revisiting some of the Phase 5 phonemes and year 1 spelling objectives from the summer term.

We will also be learning to spell some Topic/Science words Please return the spelling test book every Monday.

Dictation Exercises

The children practise their spellings in school and at home and on Friday 3 – 4 sentences are dictated to the children.

- 2 house points are awarded for 100% correct spellings
- 1 house point is awarded if one mistake was made.



Spotlight Words

At the top of the children's weekly spelling list there will be 2 – 3 spotlight words.

The children are not expected to be able to spell these.

Discuss the meaning of the words with your child as these are words which we will be discussing in school.





English

Handwriting

The children are taught to form letters with lead ins. The joins are not taught until the summer term.





Key Stage 1 Maths

What do children learn at school in Key Stage 1?

In Year 1 and Year 2 children develop their understanding of numbers so that they can confidently count and calculate with numbers up to 100, including comparing quantities of money, time and other measurements. Children also learn to describe, draw and compare different shapes.

Strategies used at school for learning number facts:

> Recall addition and subtraction facts to 10 using ten frames, for example:



> Part-whole representations for numbers up to and including 20, for example:



> Identify odd and even numbers using Numicon, for example:






Maths at Home

- Play games such as snakes and ladders.
- ■Play card games such as 21.
- Count a selection coins from a money jar and play shops.
- Follow recipes and measure ingredients.
- Regularly measure the height of all the people and animals in your home.
- ■Practise telling the time using an analogue clock. Start with o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to.
- ■Look for repeated patterns both inside and outside of the home.







<u>PE</u>

- Goldfinches Thursday (outdoor) and Tuesday (indoors)
- Children to come into school on these days in their school PE kit.
- PE kit needs to be in the school colours.
 Suitable footwear is necessary.
- Long hair tied back and earrings removed or covered up

Avoid laces!



Assessment

- SATS are no longer statutory in Year 2, they are optional. As a school, we have decided to administer these to support with teacher
 - Assessment
- If your child did not pass their phonics screening check in Year 1, this will be retaken in June.
 - The children's phonic knowledge is regularly assessed.
